

## **Outstanding Sports Facilities**

Our Level 5 Sport and Fitness students got to view and use the brand new facilities at Oriam.

Having only recently opened in August, SLC was the first FE College to gain access. Oriam, meaning I am gold in Gaelic, is Scotland's National Sports Performance Centre which was built after the McLeish report into football. With a 33-million-pound budget the centre caters for everyday members to elite athletes, including Hearts Football Team, the National Scottish Rugby and Football Teams, as well as providing important research for sport science at Heriot Watt University. Ultimately, it provides top sportsmen and women with the facilities, access and support for successful performance on the international stage.

During the trip, Gordon Strachan was in residence at the building, as were the Scottish Rugby 7's Team, who were training at the time. A talking point of the day was the world-class indoor football and rugby 3G synthetic pitches, being the same size as Hampden. The pitch has a roof shaped after the famous kick by Roberto Carols from 35 metres out - where he was able to curve the ball into the goal, which still stands as one of the most famous goals of its time, 19 years later.

The students had a great day out, learning important up-to-date information about the sports industry, helping inspire their careers and further study after their time at SLC.

The activities are contributing greatly to their development as successful learners, confident individuals, effective contributors and responsible citizens.








## In Memory


- · Ensure the recruitment process is inclusive and accessible
