
GRADUATION 20



This year's Annual Construction Awards took place in the grandeur of the Hamilton Town House on Monday
September 17. Guests were met on arrival by a Piper and escorted through to a reception area where they could meet other award winners and their guests. There were 65 students who collected awards on the night and they were well supported by family, friends and employers. The Student Association President, College and faculty staff were also present to applaud the award winners. Amongst the staff members were a number of retired lecturers who, as James Martin reminded us were the early pioneers of the faculty whose high standards we still aspire to achieve.

There was hardly a spare seat on the night with an estimated 220 guests, which included representatives from a wide array of trade associations, sponsors, guest presenters and stakeholders such as CITB, employers and Local Authorities.

The event was opened by the Principal with words of welcome and an outline of the continuing success of the College and the important role the faculty plays of delivering



qualifications and training required by industry. The Principal introduced the first guest speaker of the evening, William McNaughton. William is an adult apprentice who is in the last year of his apprenticeship and was in line to receive a couple of awards on the night. His well delivered and highly engaging speech was focused on the hard work and dedication that it takes to become a success, and how important it is to make the best of the opportunities you create.

Associate Principal James Martin was next to the podium to invite the presenters of the awards to the stage before announcing the names of the award winners from the following categories: Endeavour Awards, Pre-Apprenticeship, Painting and Decorating, Plastering, Bricklaying, Roof Slating and Tiling, Carpentry and Joinery, Plumbing, Gas and Sustainability, HNC and HND Construction Management, Surveying and Quantity Surveying. This concluded the first part of the evening and guests enjoyed the opportunity during the interval to share success stories and some light refreshments.

The second part of the evening was commenced by the Principal who introduced Guest Speaker, Iona Oliver. Iona is a lecturer in the Construction Faculty and she delivered a serious message of achieving greater gender balance in the Construction Industry which is something that the faculty share her passion for and commitment to.

The success of all our student competitors who have represented the college at local, regional and national was celebrated at the night and it was noted that two of the recipients are going on to represent the College at the UK National Skillbuild finals in November. The audience showed their appreciation of these students with a resounding round of applause and before they left the stage James Martin wished them all continued success, especially our two UK Skillbuild Finalists Jed Smith (Bricklaying) and James Westland (Carpentry and Joinery).







The climax of the awards night is the selection from over 2000 students of the 'Best of the Best'. This award is presented to the best overall Faculty of Construction student from all disciplines and across all programmes of study.

The recipient will have demonstrated outstanding commitment to learning their craft skills and knowledge, as well as contributing to the learning of others and enhancing the reputation of the College. Tension filled the room as the names of the three shortlisted nominees and the testimony from their lecturers was read out and you could have heard a pin drop in that moment of suspense before Dylon McLauchlan's name was announced. Dylon made his way to the stage to collect his award with his family and employer's standing ovation adding to the applause of the audience. Presenting Dylon was the Sponsor of this award Alec Douglas, Managing Director of South Lanarkshire Building Supplies.

Closing remarks and the vote of thanks were provided by the Chair of the College Board of Management, Andy Kerr. As Chair he paid tribute to the success of the students, the support they receive from family, employers and their lecturers and all of the hard work that had went into organising the event.

Scottish Tourism Conference

Our HND Travel and Tourism students attended the Scottish Tourism Alliance conference at the EICC, Edinburgh with lecturer Joan Bell. The visit went extremely well as the students were able to network with representatives from many companies within the hospitality and tourism sectors as well being able to listen to various guest speakers.

The students are currently working on 'The Influences on the Travel and Tourism Industry' unit as part of their course and this conference gave many insights into what is impacting many areas. The guest speakers gave insightful knowledge into the positive and negative impacts on the Scottish Tourism. The students were set a task to detail Political, Economical, Social, Technological, Environmental and Legal issues affecting the Travel and Tourism Industry in Scotland discussed by each speaker. These notes will act as excellent primary and secondary research which will assist them with content for 2 reports that must be completed as part of the unit.

They had an excellent opportunity to hear Nicola Sturgeon, First Minister for Scotland discuss issues such as Brexit, how it will impact Scottish Tourism, WiFi Connectivity in rural parts of Scotland, the Transport Infrastructure, areas for improvement e.g. ferry network to the Western Isles, Tourism Tax, the First Minister committed to enter into consultation with COSLA and the STA over this hot topic. This certainly gave the students plenty of material.

Networking opportunities are excellent at these events and I have secured a class visit surrounding sustainability with the Fisher Group, who provide laundry services for most of the hotels in Scotland. They pride themselves in sustainable practices in their factory in Coatbridge. This visit will act as a direct link for the HND students studying Planning and Sustainable Development in Tourism.

Overall, the STA Conference was an excellent learning opportunity for the students and assisted me with my learning and teaching of the above unit.



Dulux Academy

Our Painting and Decorating Department are proud to announce that we're now a Dulux Academy, in fact, we're the only one in Scotland.

The aim of the academy is to revive, protect and promote the painting and decorating industry, using a team of industry leading experts to support training. Partnerships with several leading suppliers and manufacturers from the industry allows this training to take place, using the most advanced materials and equipment that the industry has to offer.

We'll be one of only 5 satellite academies across the UK, with the others being based in Leeds, Bolton, Walsall and Lincoln. Dulux also have 2 main academies, one is based at their head quarters in Slough, and the other is at the new state of the art production facility in Ashington.

Our staff and students will benefit greatly from having the Dulux Academy on site, with CPD events, not only from Dulux experts, but from partners such as Tesa, Mirka and Graham and Brown. Staff and students will also attend training events at the main academy in Ashington, take part in guided tours of the paint production plant and have access to the nearby Graham and Brown wallpaper factory.

We'll be holding an event to celebrate the opening of our academy, and will no doubt have some Dulux experts and staff in attendance, we're very excited to say that the guest of honour that day will be the Dulux Dog!



Tesa Tapes

Tesa Tapes visited the College as part of our partnership with the Dulux Academy. They're a leading manufacturer of tapes and adhesives and are especially recognised throughout the painting and decorating sector for the quality of their precision range of masking tapes, and the training programme they have rolled out designed for professional decorators of the future.

Students were given the opportunity to try the tapes in practical situations and were also given free samples. SEC Tour

Our HNC Events and Tourism classes were extremely fortunate to receive various talks and a tour of the newly branded SEC, Scottish Event Campus comprising of the SEC, Hydro and Armadillo. We're the only college to receive this tour as they normally only work with students from Strathclyde University.

The Head of International Conferences spoke about the bids process and how they reach their £6 million annual target. She also spoke about the importance of working with other organisations such as Visit Scotland and the Glasgow Convention Bureau to sell not only the venue space but Glasgow and Scotland as a whole.

The Head of Exhibitions spoke about the 50+ exhibitions they deliver annually which fall into different sectors such as trade, consumers and how the approach their tenders.

The Head of Security went into great detail of the significant change in public safety after the Manchester Arena attack and all the new risk profiling they now have in place. They work closely with all emergency services and have various strategies in place to make sure they're prepared for any eventuality. She also briefly spoke about their sustainable policies, such as, their Gold Green Tourism Business Scheme Award, planting 160,000 trees a year and working with the community on various recycling and food composting initiatives.

All in all, it was an extremely insightful tour with the most up to date industry information shared with the students.

Hopefully this can become an annual visit for the students as it links into many of their assessments and provides them with essential information for their research projects.

The HR manager said she would email all the powerpoints so we can use them in class to share with the students.




The breakout session was designed to be fun, informative and enhanced our cross-college collaboration.


